
UH Burn Center Patient Transfer Decision Guide revised 4 30 2020



Burn Center Referral Criteria **

- f > 10% TBSA burn or
- f Chemical burns
- f Inhalation injury
- f Any third degree burn
- f Electrical injury (including lightning)
- # Burns involving face, hands, feet, genitalia, perineum, or joints
- # Extremes of age- any pediatric or geriatric patient
- # Any burn injury complex comorbidities that could complicate management
- # Burns and mechanical trauma-pose the greatest risk of morbidity and mortality

Outpatient Criteria ***

criteria **

f Small burns, Pain controlled with pills

F Reliable patient / support structure

7 Does not meet Burn Center Referral

Patient who requires special social emotional, or long term rehab interventions

CW Inpatient Criteria ****

- f <15% TBSA without complicating factors
- f Acceptance by on-call pediatric surgeon

Adult vs. Pediatric *

- f Consideration will be given to the patients size, medical condition(s)
- f Consultation with on-call pediatric surgeon will be sought for unclear cases

Pediatric Burn Center Referral Criteria *****

<13 years old with >15% TBSA or any burn with complicating factors (see Burn Center Referral Criteria) should be referred to a pediatric burn center. These patients are at high risk of resuscitation miscalculation and hypothermia, especially with long transfers. Shriner's in Galveston is setup for large / catastrophic burns. UAB is a secondary option in these cases.
