## Political Science, Criminal Justice & Public Administration: Tenure-Track

The Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice at the University of South Alabama invites applications for a full-time (9 month), tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Public Administration to begin August 15, 2025. An earned Ph.D. in Political Science, Public Administration, Public Policy, or a closely related subfield (e.g., Healthcare and/or Epidemiology within Public Policy, Disaster Management within Public Administration, etc.) is required at the time of appointment. ABDs currently near the completion of the degree are welcome to apply, but an earned Ph.D. is required at the time of appointment.

The Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice is recognized for its research active faculty, award-winning teaching, and its collegiality. Since the Fall 2022 semester, the Department has earned multiple grants, teaching awards, scholarship awards, and published research in top research journals such as *Spine*. Applicants must have teaching and research interests in the area of Public Administration, Public Policy, Political Science, and/or closely related subfields and demonstrate a history or ability to publish in Public Administration or Public Policy outlets. The successful candidate is expected to teach courses principally in the MPA program but should also be prepared to offer undergraduate courses. In addition to research and teaching, the successful candidate will be expected to advise a diverse student body, many of whom are first-generation college students, and be actively involved in service to the department, college, and community. Demonstrated commitment to valuing diversity and contributing to an inclusive working and learning environment is highly important. Our department is committed to increasing the diversity of its faculty and encourages faculty from historically underrepresented groups to apply. We value diversity which, in addition to race, national origin, religion, gender, intersectional identities, and other protected groups, also includes faculty with unique backgrounds and life experiences which will contribute to our evergrowing department.
